

TRAFFIC AND PARKING PLAN FOR GRADUATION DAY, May 6, 2017

TO: All Graduates, Faculty, Staff, and Guests

The Main Entrance as well as the Green Street Gate to the campus will be open for incoming traffic. Be sure to display your dashboard sign if one has been e-mailed to you. It will help UPD officers to get you where you need to be quickly and easily.

Traffic control signs and cones will help guide motorists to various parking areas. Several Guards and Officers will be on the streets and lots to direct traffic and usher pedestrians safely across the streets. Please allow them to assist you.

Residential Graduates: Please park on your dormitory parking lot or at the Glaske Bldg parking lot. Graduates residing in Tyler West dormitory, please park on the Tyler East or Trinity parking lot to help make extra room for your families and guests.

Global Graduates: Please park at the Margaret Estes Library parking lot (turn right upon entering campus onto Glaske Dr). Overflow parking for Global Graduates will be at the Solheim Activity Center across the street to the south from the library lot.

Faculty/Staff: Please park in your office area or at the east side of Solheim Activity Center lot along the side of the tennis courts.

Graduation Workers: Please park in your office area or on the Glaske Building parking lot.

Family Members, Guests: Will be directed to park in the Tyler West and Belcher Center parking lots as well as onto the grass field at the north end of the Belcher lot. Several UPD Guards and Officers will be there to assist you in parking.

Handicap/Special Needs Parking: Available on the Belcher Center parking lot as much as it remains available. Guards will assist in finding available spaces.

After the ceremony we will be allowing traffic to exit the campus through three gates; the main entrance, the Belcher parking lot gate, which both exit to Mobberly Avenue, and the Green St. gate which exits onto Green St south of Mobberly Ave.

The University Police Department recognizes and applauds the dedication and work that has been accomplished by our graduates. It is our prayer that each graduate and their family will have a wonderful day of celebration and that our efforts will honor their years of dedication and effort in earning their degree from LeTourneau University.
